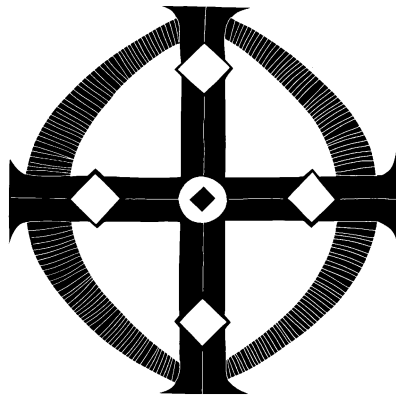
PROFESSION OF FAITH – APOSTLE’S CREED
